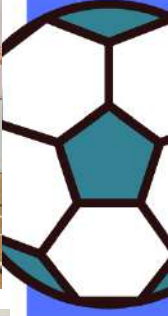
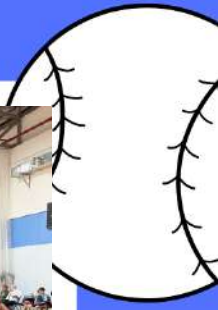
### **Match report for the Girls u9 Benchball fixture on Monday, the 31st of October 2022.**

On Tuesday, the 1st of November, the Sri KDU U15 football team played two games against two schools. We qualified for plate final.

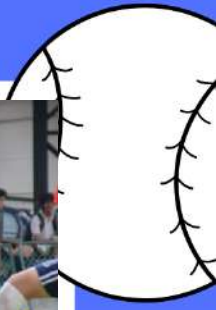
