Last weekend, on the 29th and 30th of October 2023, Garden International School hosted an exciting friendly swimming gala that brought together swimmers from various schools in the region.

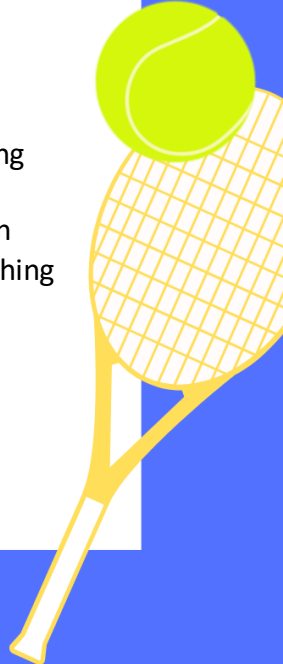
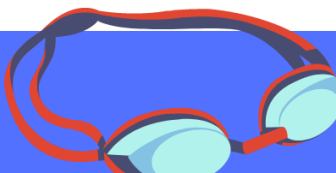

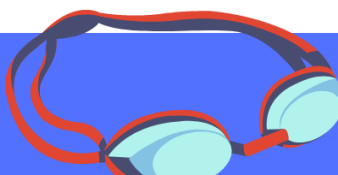
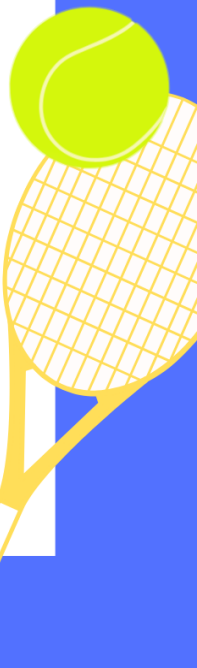
SWIM REPORT CONTINUED

GIRLS MATCH REPORTS



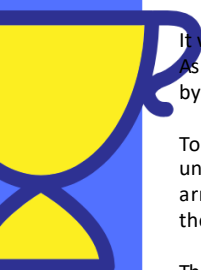

Overall, we came 3rd. Of course we were disappointed, but it was a wonderful learning experience and opportunity to improve.

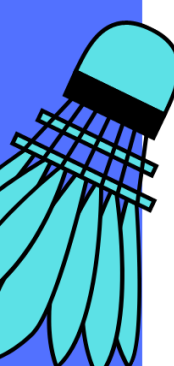
