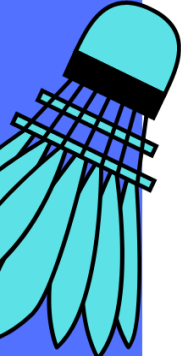

Ali: What I liked about KTJ Games was playing football, having lunch and getting my gold medal after my 800m run.

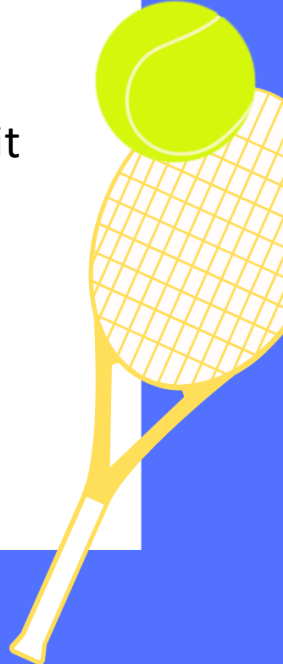
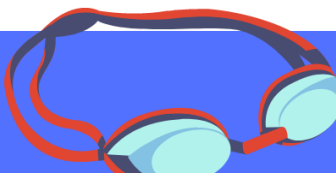
