





## O15 GIRLS AIMS BADMINTON FINAL @ SUNWAY 8 MARCH 2024

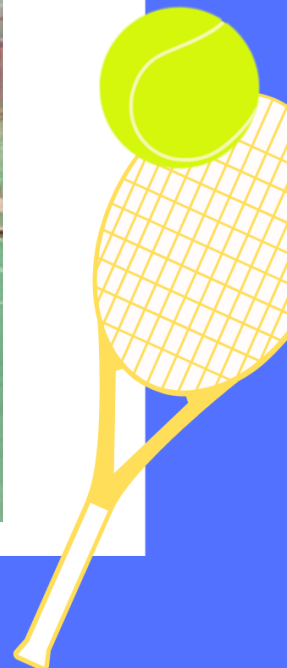
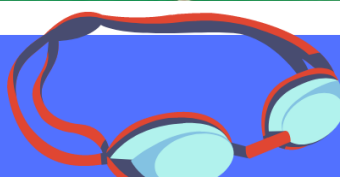
## O15 BOYS AIMS BADMINTON FINAL @ ACE SPORTS WORLD 8 MARCH 2024
